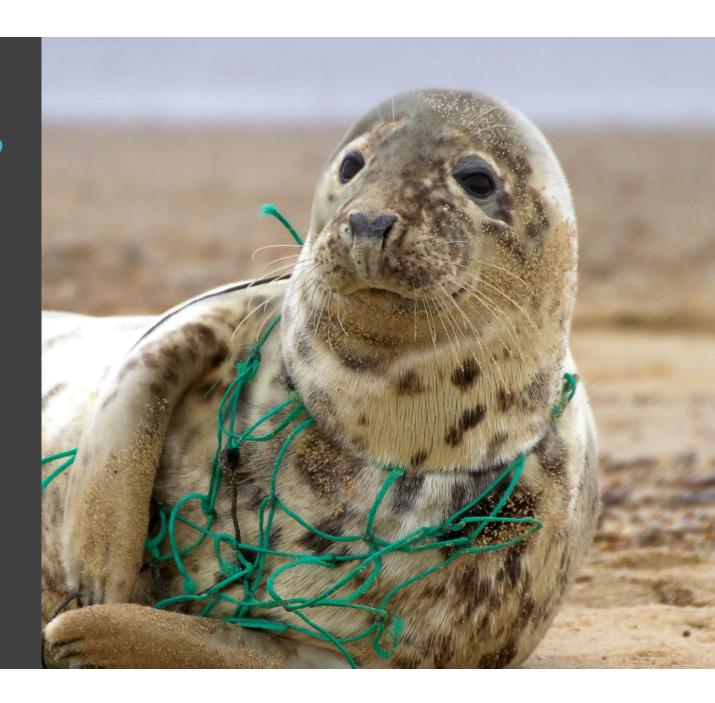

Stop ocean plastic by gathering 1 billion people together to monetize waste and improve lives

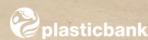

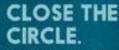


NEW PRODUCTs

Conscious consumers are empowered to effect change by purchasing your Social Plantic products. In addition consumers will be able to seek out Plantic Neutral products. Sales revenues are reintegrated into the value chain to expand Ecosystems and to pay Collector Rewards.

COLLECTING

Ocean-bound plastic polluting waterways and communities is collected b Social Plastic Members and enters the Social Plastic Ecosystem.



Social Plastic products are returned for recycling, creating a closed-loop plastic economy

TRANSPORT

Social Plastic is shipped to manufacturers, where it is made into new plastic products.



REWARDING

Members drop off their hauf at Social Plastic Branches and are paid Social Plastic Collector Rewards in addition to the market rate for plastic.



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PROCESSING

Collected plastic is sent to a local partner for processing into bales, flakes or pellets called Social Plastic.



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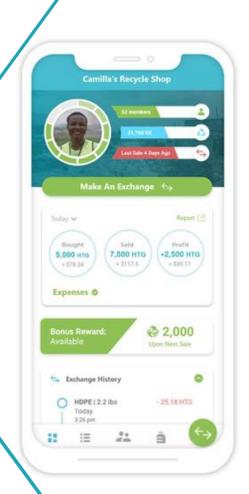
2a. Members can be paid in cash or blockchain-secured digital tokens, which can be exchanged for goods and life necessities that significantly improve living standards.

CASE STUDY: HENKEL

In a partnership with Henkel AG, our first SOCIAL PLASTIC® ecosystem launched in Haiti in 2014

As a mostly rural and impoverished country, Haiti has a very underdeveloped recycling industry with little recycling infrastructure

3 Henkel – Plastic Bank branches in the Portau-Prince region were constructed and activated, enabling locals to convert pollution into wealth



Those branches now produce the SOCIAL PLASTIC® used in the manufacturing of Henkel products







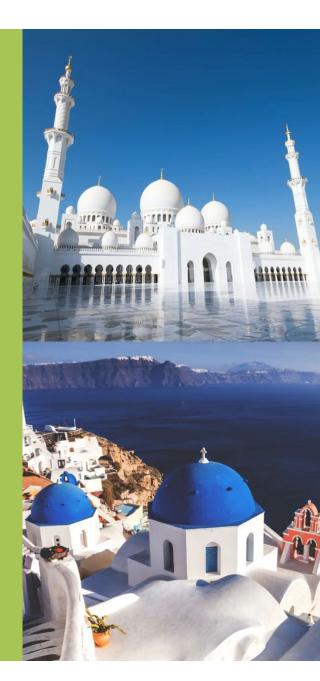


ENGAGING PEOPLE OF FAITH

All faith emphasize the importance to care for creation.

By amplifying Plastic Bank's mission, congregations prevent ocean plastic and sustainably redistribute wealth to our most disenfranchised communities.

People of Faith are becoming more aware of the ocean plastic problem. While they strive to reduce their personal plastic footprints, they look to their faith for direction.



WHAT CAN FAITH COMMUNITITES DO?

Congregations in the Global South

In regions with lots of mismanaged plastic, mobilize your community to set up a Plastic Bank Collection Point and teach believers to reduce their plastic footprint (5R- Framework: Refuse, Rethink, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle). Local residents benefit directly by generating new income for their families and improved access to life necessities.

Congregations in the Global North

In regions with adequate recycling infrastructure, encourage parishioners to neutralize their plastic footprint with Plastic Bank. Plastic Neutral contributions help expand global recycling systems and pay higher rewards to recyclers in developing nations.

Congregations engaging from the developed world can be directly matched with participating congregations in emerging regions, strengthening ties between international congregations.

Option 1: Waste Audit

- Do an actual examination on what waste and what volume you generate.
- Divide into biodegradable, recycable and disposable waste
- Examine your waste for 5 Rs
- Refuse
- Rethink
- Reduce
- Reuse
- Recycle
- Plan your waste streams to be more sustainably
